E.g. 'Take 2 steps



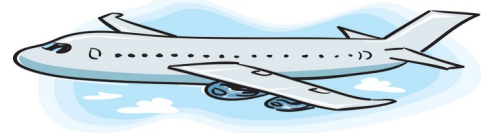

Watch an episode of Dr Who or the film Back to the Future. Design your own time travel machine. Write



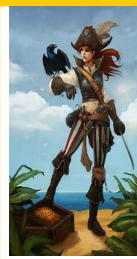
What is a pirate?
