This week you are going to learn how to read map coordinates.
Coordinates are a set of numbers or numbers and letters together that show you a position on a map. They can help you find a specific place or object that you are looking for.

Coordinates are written in brackets and separated by a comma: (H, 4). The first number indicates the point on the $x$ axis and the second the point on the $y$ axis. When reading coordinates you always go across first and then up (a good way to remember this is: 'across the landing and up the stairs').
