We have put all the literacy activities for the whole week into one document for you to access. We hope this will make it easier for you to download the home learning. You will notice that there are still 4 separate literacy based activities for your child to complete throughout the week.

Activity 1

Nature ABC Book

Either use a notebook or fold several pieces of A4 paper in half, so you get 26 pages, plus a cover and a back page. Then begin your adventure outside by hunting for things that begin with each letter of the alphabet. Write the letter on 1 page and draw a picture of the object on the same page. You can even include a description of each item. Please make sure an adult is with you while you are outside!and you listen to them!
