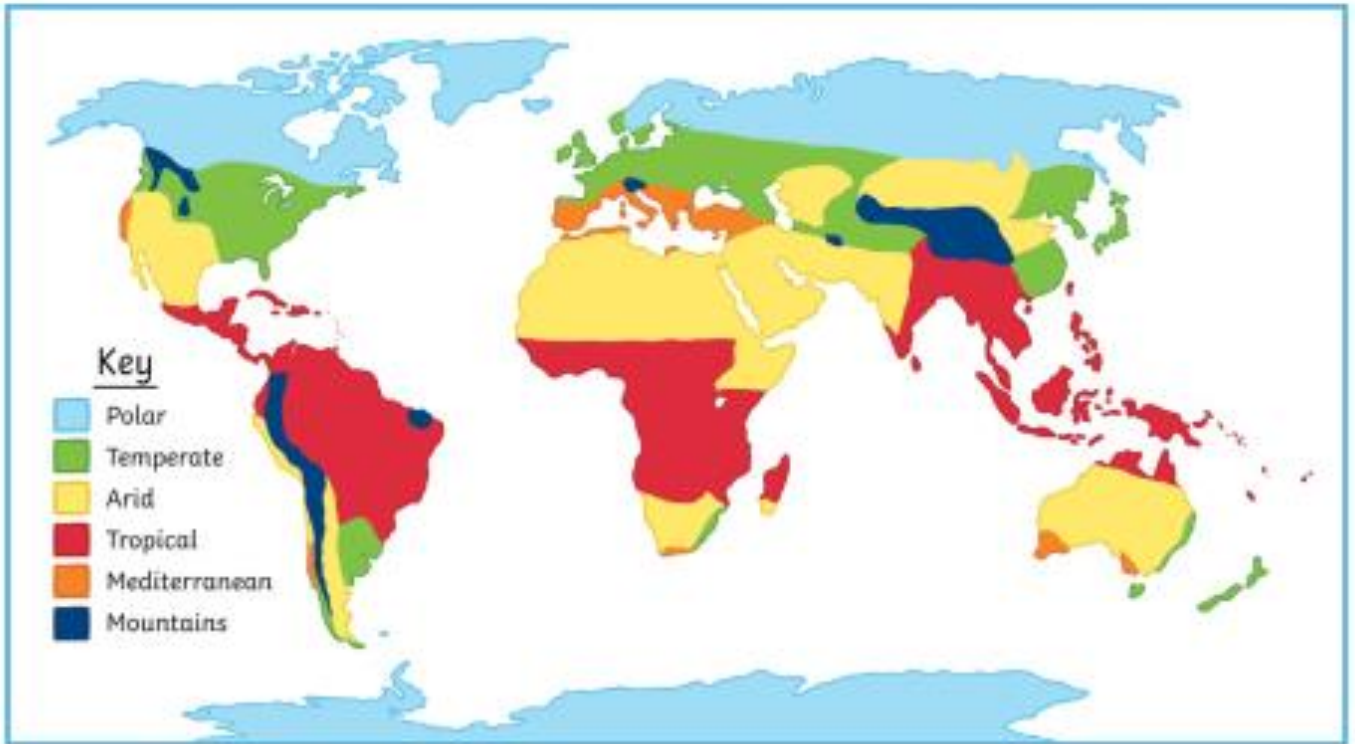

- Cold and wet in winter.
- Warm and light in summer.
- Often cloudy and rainy.
- Four Seasons: Spring, Summer, Autumn and Winter.

- In the Arctic Circle.
- It is very, very cold all year.
- In some parts of the year, it can be dark all day.
- Lots of snow and rain all year round.



Luxor, Egypt



- In the Sahara Desert.
- It almost never rains.
- Strong winds can cause sandstorms.
- In all seasons the sun is extremely strong.
- Always very hot or warm in the day.

Los Angeles, USA



- Warm and sunny all year.
- Only rains a little during Winter.
- Can be very hot in Summer.

Sydney, Australia



- Hot or warm most of the year.
- Can rain all year but it rains more in Summer.
- In the summer, it can be very, very hot.

Manaus, Brazil



- Close to the equator.
- Rains a lot all year.
- A tropical climate - warm or hot all year.
- Large areas of rainforest.
